Crochet Owl

Hook size: 4

Materials:

green garden string,
natural cotton string,
white cotton,
hessian,
cardboard,
wadding for stuffing

Main Body

Body Yarn: cotton or cotton string,

Slip knot first and hold the loop open

Row 1

Chain up 2 stitch

Crochet 8 double crochet stitches into the open loop. Slip stitch the double crochets together. Pull the circle in the middle closed.

Row 2

Chain up 2 crochets and work 2 double crochets into each stitch – should end up with 16 double crochets.

Row 3

Chain up 2 crochets and work 2 double crochets into each stitch – should end up with 32 double crochets.

Row 4

Chain up 2 crochets, working 1 double crochet into the first stitch, 2 double crochets into the 2nd stitch. Repeat 1212 all the way around the circle, slip-stitch closed - should end up with 48 double crochets.

Rows 5 - 14

Chain up 2 crochets working 1 double crochet into each stitch, slipstitch closed.

Row 15

Chain up 1 crochet, work a single crochet into the next 5 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 19 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 5 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 19 stitches, slipstitch closed.



Row 16

Chain up 1 crochet, work a single crochet into the next 7 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 15 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 9 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 15 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 2 stitch, slipstitch closed.

Row 17

Chain up 1 crochet, work a single crochet into the next 9 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 11 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 13 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 11 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 4 stitch, slipstitch closed.

Row 18

Chain up 1 crochet, work a single crochet into the next 11 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 7 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 17 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 7 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 6 stitch, slipstitch closed.

Row 19

Chain up 1 crochet, work a single crochet into the next 11 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 7 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 17 stitches, work a double crochet into the next 7 stitches, work a single crochet into the next 6 stitch, slipstitch closed.

Row 20

Chain up 1, work a single crochet into all of the 48 stitches, slipstitch closed.

Sew the loose threads back in to the crochet stitches to secure, cut off excess thread.

Eyes

Using the green garden string & white cotton

Row 1

Chain up 1 stitch

crochet 6 single crochet stitches into the open loop. Slip stitch the single crochets together.

Pull the circle in the middle closed.

Row 2

Chain up 1 crochet and work 2 single crochets into each stitch – should end up with 12 single crochets.

Change yarn to white cotton

Row 3

Chain up 1 crochet, working 2 single crochet into the first stitch, 1 single crochet into the 2nd stitch. Repeat 2121 all the way around the circle, slipstitch circle closed.



Row 4

Chain up 1 crochet, working 2 single crochet into the first stitch, 1 single crochet into the 2nd stitch & 3rd stitch. Repeat 211211 all the way around the circle.

Row 5

Chain up 1 crochet, working 2 single crochet into the first stitch, 1 single crochet into the 2nd, 3rd and 4th stitch. Repeat 21112111 all the way around the circle, slipstitch closed.

Sew the loose threads back in to the crochet stitches to secure, cut off excess thread.

Nose

Using the green garden string

**Row 1**

Chain up 8 stitches.

Row 2

Turn chain up one stitch and work a single crochet into the second stitch in, continue working a single crochet into the following 7 stitches.

Row 3

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 7 stitches.

Row 4

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 6 stitches.

Row 5

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 5 stitches.

Row 6

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 4 stitches.

Row 7

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 3 stitches.

Row 8

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 2 stitches.

Row 9

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next single stitch, slipstitch closed.

Sew the loose threads back in to the crochet stitches to secure, cut off excess thread.

Wings

Using the green garden string & natural cotton string

Row 1

Chain up 12 stitches.

Row 2

Turn chain up one stitch and work a single crochet into the second stitch in, continue working a single crochet into the following 12 stitches.

Row 3

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 11 stitches.

Row 4

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 10 stitches.

Row 5

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 9 stitches.

Row 6

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 8 stitches.

Row 7

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 7 stitches.

Row 8

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 6 stitches.

Row 9

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 5 stitches.

Row 10

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 4 stitches.

Row 11

Turn, skipping the first stitch work a single crochet into the next 3 stitches, slipstitch closed.

Row 12

Along the triangle section, beginning where you started the first chain work single crochets along the two sides, approx. 23/24 single crochets.

Row 13

Turn, chain up 1, work a single crochet into each stitch, at the tip of the wing work 2 single crochets into the two stitches at the tip of the owl's wing.

Row 14

Turn, chain up 3 stitches, work a single crochet into the first stitch, work a single crochet into the next stitch, chain up 3 and work a single crochet into the next stitch, work a single crochet into the next stitch, continue the sequence until you reach the end, slipstitch closed.

Sew the loose threads back in to the crochet stitches to secure, cut off excess thread.



Fabric Insert

Fabric - Hessian

Print out the pattern.

Cut out the three sections, 1 piece cardboard, 1 fabric base & 2 for the fabric body.



Sew the Owl bodies together leaving an opening for turning it at the top of the body.

Sew in the circle at the base of the Owl.

Turn the owl right side out. Insert the piece of cardboard into the base.

Assembling the Owl

Sew the eyes and nose in position.

Fill the hessian body with wadding and sew up the top of the body.

Insert the hessian lining into the crochet owl body.

Sew up the top of the Owl's head.

Finally sew the wings on at an angle. (Please refer to the following picture)

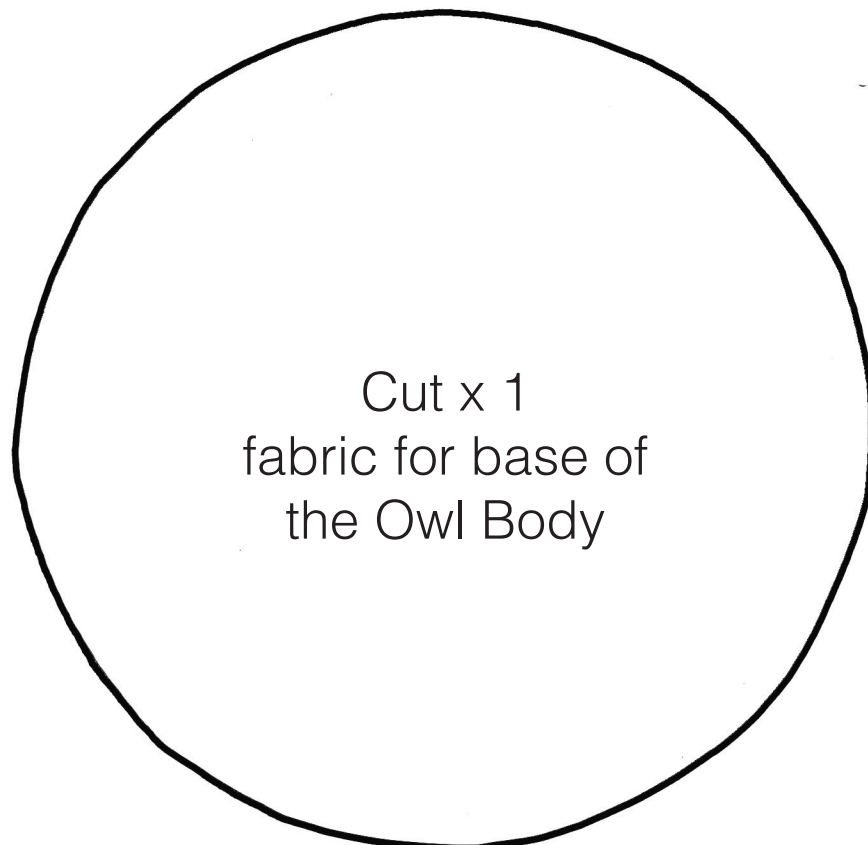
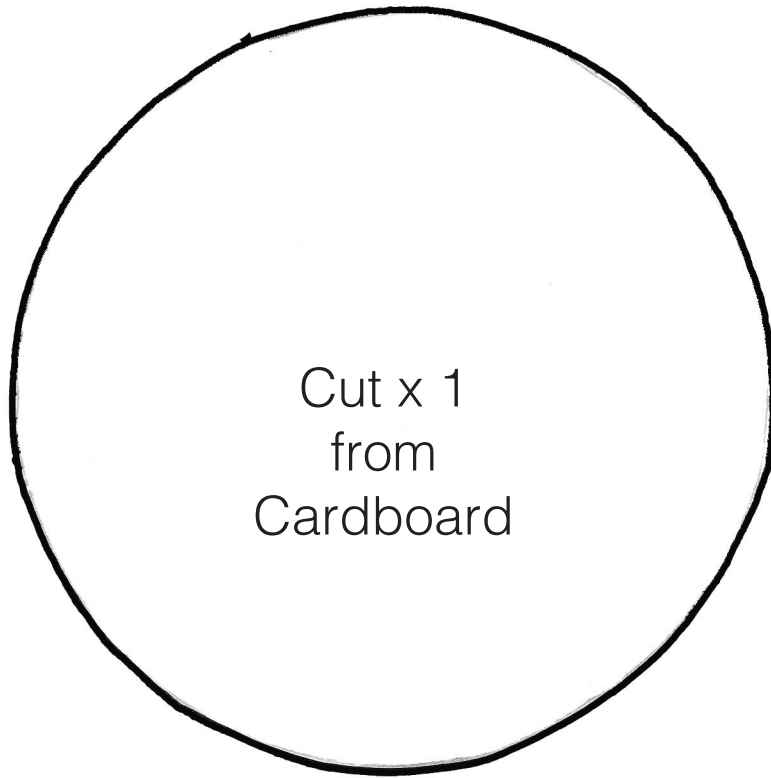
