Cowl Chain Scarf

Gauge 13 stitches x 14 rows = 4" x 4"

Yarn

Candy & Grass colors used in the pattern

100 gram balls will make 2 cowl scarves

Crochet hook:

6.5mm / K/10 1/2

Stitches abbreviations:

Chain stitches ch(s)

Slipstitch (sl st)

Single crochet (sc)

*** * * * ***

Foundation row

Chain up 14 stitches

Row 1

Work 1 sc into the 2nd stitch; continue working 1 sc into each stitch (13 in total)

Rows 2 - 14

Turn. Chain up 1, work 1 sc into each stitch (13 in total)

At this point you have completed the crochet square, which is the basic structure that the crochet chains are attached to.



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Note: As you are working the following lines of chain stitches, make sure to line each set of chain stitches up to the previous lines to ensure none of the chains twist. This will involve you rotating the square as to attach each chain on to the opposite ends.

Row 15

100 ch(s) & sl st into the 1st stitch of your initial foundation chain.



Row 16

100 ch(s) & sl st back into the 1st stitch of the 14th row you completed.



Row 17

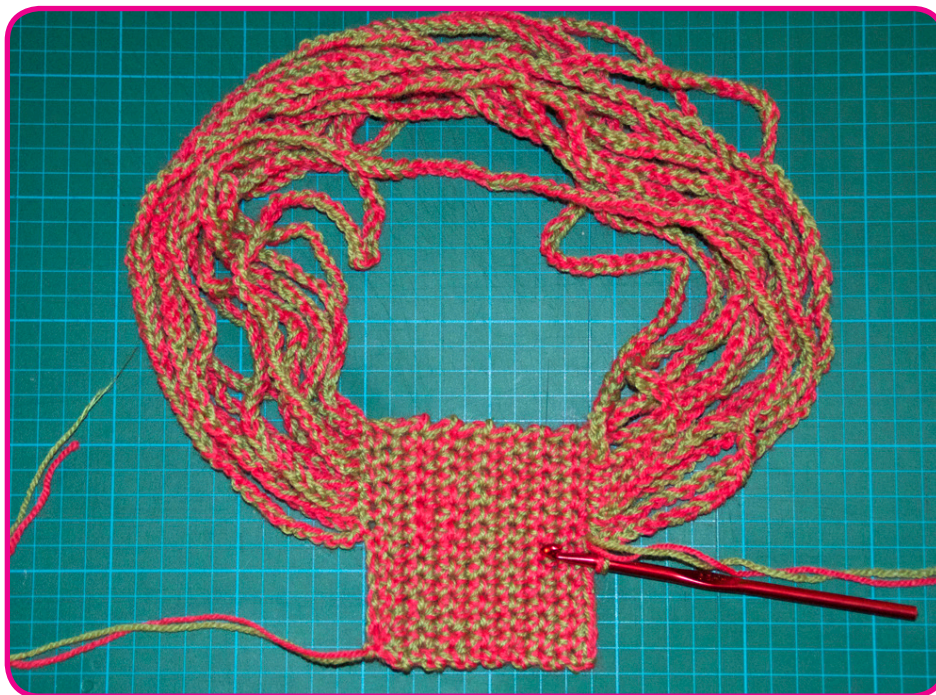
100 ch(s) & sl st into the 2nd stitch of your foundation row.

Row 18

100 ch(s) & sl st into the 2nd stitch of the 14th row you completed.

Rows 19 to 37

100 ch(s) & sl st into the next (3rd, 4th, 5th , 6th , 7th, 8th, 9th , 10th, 11th, 12th) stitch of your foundation row.
100 ch(s) & sl st into the next stitch of the (3rd, 4th, 5th , 6th , 7th, 8th, 9th , 10th, 11th, 12th) row you completed. You will now have 24 chains.



Row 38

100 ch(s) & sl st into the 13th stitch of your foundation row.

Row 39

100 ch(s) & sl st closed into the 13th stitch of the 14th row you completed.

Using a darning needle sew all of the yarn threads back into the Crochet Cowl Scarf.

Flower & Wrap

Yarn

Flower - Use only the candy colored yarn for the flower.

Wrap - Use the candy and the grass colors together.

Crochet hook for flower & wrap:

4 mm / G6

Stitches abbreviations:

Chain stitches ch(s)

Slipstitch (sl st)

Single crochet (sc)

Double crochet (dc)

Triple crochet (trc)

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Flower

Foundation row

Chain up 60 stitches

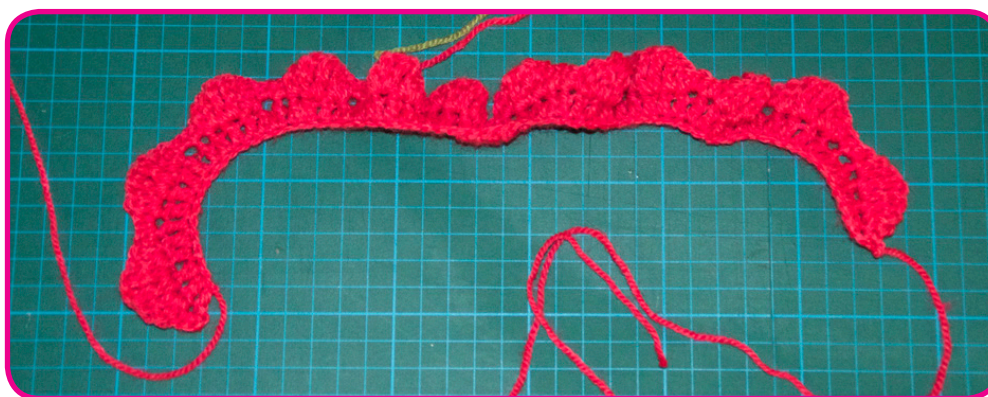
Row 2

Turn - chain up 2 stitches and work a dc into each chain. (60 dc in total)

Row 3

Turn – chain up 1, Work 2 sc into the first stitch, 2 dc into the second stitch, 2 trc into the third stitch, 2 dc into the fourth stitch, 2 sc into the fifth stitch. Repeat until the end of the row. Sl st closed.

Roll the petals loosely around in a circle as shown in the picture. Sew in position.



Detailed pictures of the flower on the following page:

1. Completed foundation chain and row 2.
2. 1st petal at the start of row 3.
3. Completed row 3.
4. Loosely roll the petals into the shape of a flower.
5. Move petals gently until you are happy with the shape.
- 6 & 7. Turn the flower over, thread a darning needle with the yarn that is attached to the center petal and sew the petals in position working from the inside out. To finish thread the darning needle with the yarn from the last petal and sew back into the flower.
8. Finished flower.

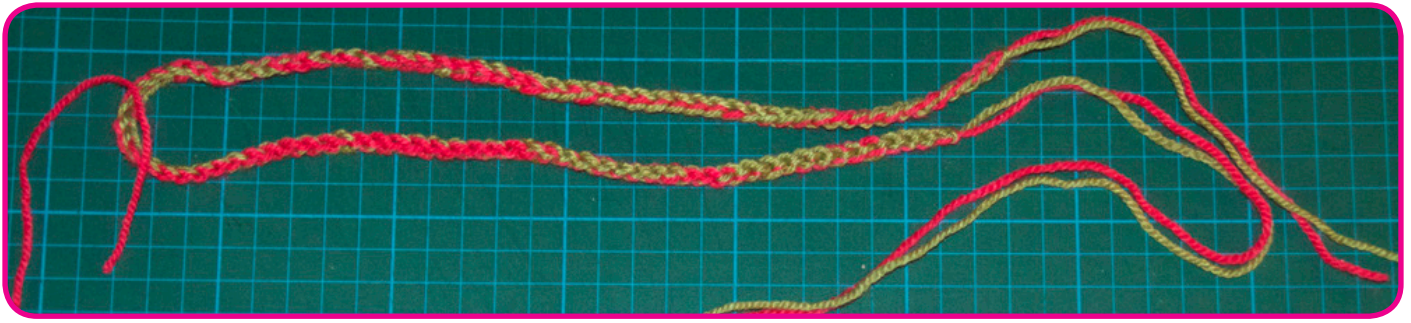

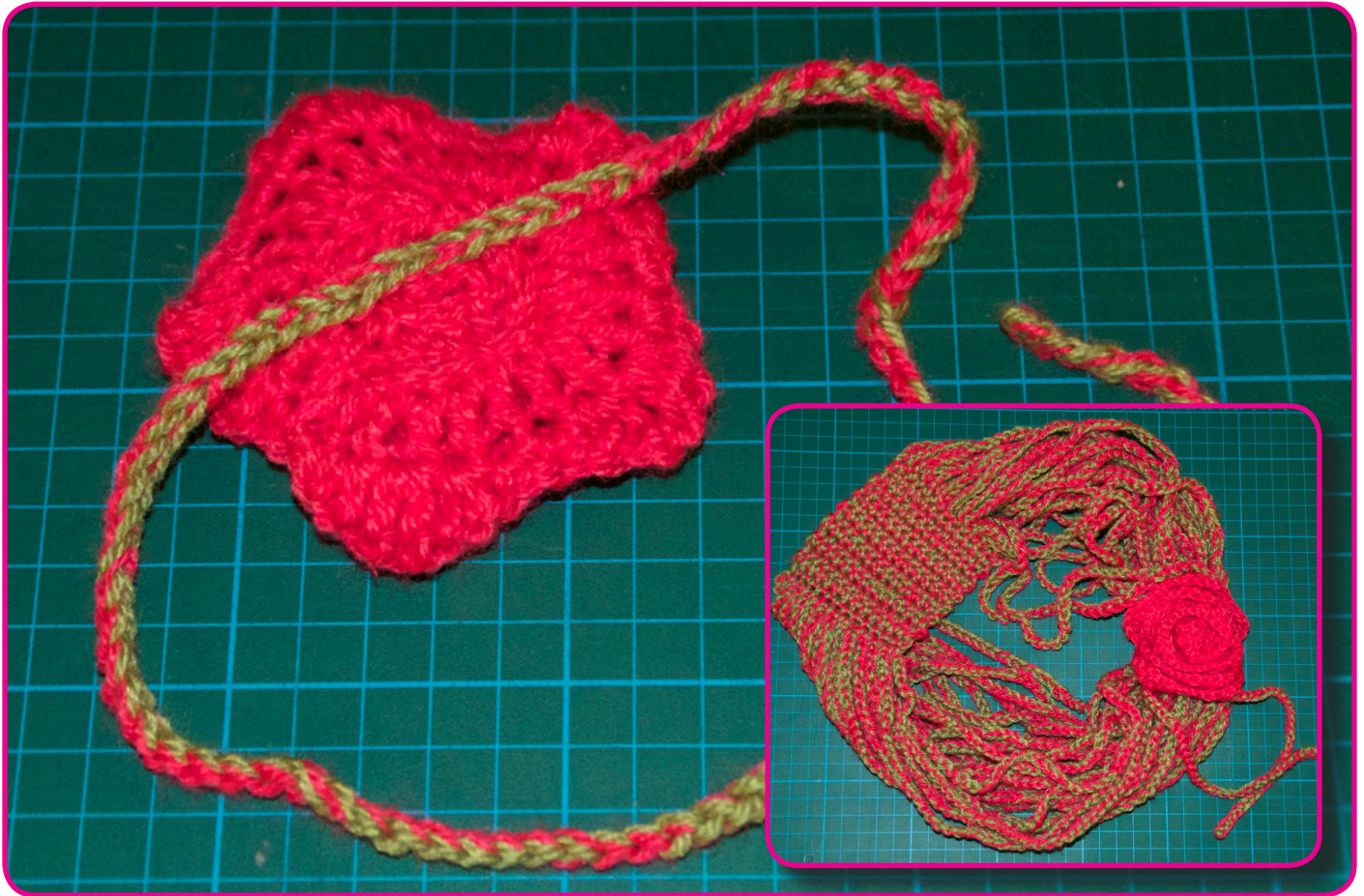

Row 1

Use both the grass & candy colored yarn together, chain up 100 stitches, sl st closed. Sew the ends back into the row of chain stitches with a darning needle to secure the ends.



Sew the wrap onto the back of the flower with the darning needle using the candy yarn.

This can either be tied around the scarf (see picture above) to hold the chain rows together, or can be worn separately as a wrist bracelet.

Options:

Make 2 or 3 flowers and tie them around the scarf.

Make the scarf one color by crocheting 2 balls of the DK yarn together.
